

# Your wealth transfer (Part 1)

## The wealth of the sinner is laid up for the just.

Proverbs 13:22

The wealth of the wicked belongs to those who believe and live the Word of God. It's waiting to be transferred into the hands of righteous men and women who finance the preaching of the gospel in these last days. Victory belongs to God's people. And guess what? No matter what happens in the world, God's people will thrive.

Do you believe that? Are you ready to take your faith to a new level? Are you ready to take the limits off and open your life to the flood of blessing that God wants to deliver to you? If so, then you must believe His Word and renew your mind with that Proverb 13:22 promise.

*"The wealth of the sinner is laid up for the just."* What a promise that is! And God confirms it time and again in His Word:

- Proverbs 15:6 says, *"In the house of the righteous is much treasure: but in the revenues of the wicked is trouble."*
- Job 36:11 says, *"If they obey and serve him, they shall spend their days in prosperity, and their years in pleasures."*
- Luke 6:38 says, *"Give, and it shall be given unto you; good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over, shall men give into your bosom. For with the same measure that ye mete withal it shall be measured to you again."*

You (as a part of the glorious body of Christ) are in a season of wealth transfer. It's time when you will have treasure and prosperity given back to you. Believe that!

Through history, there have been six wealth transfers, and I believe we are now entering the seventh. Understanding the previous wealth transfers is important because just as God was faithful to those who received those transfers – Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, the children of Israel, and Solomon – He'll also be faithful to you.

### Wealth Transfer #1: Abraham

In Genesis 12, God called Abram (his original name) out of Haran and gave him the promised land. When Abram entered the land, the first thing he did was build an altar in worship and obedience. That act of obedience triggered his harvest. But the transfer in Abraham's life didn't stop. In Genesis 12:16 it says he had *"sheep, and oxen, and he asses, and menservants, and maidservants, and she asses, and camels"*. This occurred after God led Abram to Egypt during famine. He returned home blessed beyond measure with Pharaoh's wealth!

### Wealth Transfer #2: Isaac

The next wealth transfer occurred to Abraham's son Isaac. Isaac sowed a seed, and the harvest he received was unstoppable. *"Then Isaac sowed in that land, and received in the same year a hundredfold: and the Lord blessed him. And the man waxed great, and went forward, and grew until he became very rich: For he had possession of flocks, and possession of herds, and great store of servants: and the Philistines envied him"*, (Genesis 26:12-14)

### Wealth Transfer #3: Jacob

For Jacob, that obedience included keeping his word and honoring the Lord despite another person's treachery. When Laban, Jacob's father-in-law, tried to take advantage of Jacob, Laban lost everything. At the end of their time together Jacob told his wives, Leah and Rachel, the Lord had given him everything their father owned (Gen. 31). What belonged to their father was now his.

### Wealth Transfer #4: Joseph

Then look at the life of Joseph. Sold into slavery and then imprisoned, Joseph later rose to become the leader of Egypt, answering only to Pharaoh. In Genesis 41, Pharaoh bestowed this position on Joseph: *"Thou shalt be over my house, and according unto thy word shall all my people be ruled: only in the throne will I be greater than thou"* (vers 40). For Joseph, his wealth transfer included promotion.
