Wealth Transfer #5: Israel

Years later, when the time came for the people of Israel to be released from Egypt, God blessed them, too. The plagues had left Egypt in ruins. When the Israelites asked one final time to leave Egypt, they didn't go empty-handed. Just look at what the Lord did for them:

"I will give this people favor in the sight of the Egyptians: and it shall come to pass, that, when you go, you shall not go empty. But every woman shall borrow of her neighbour, and of her that sojourneth in her house, jewels of silver, and jewels of gold, and raiment: and you shall put them upon your sons, and upon your daughters; and you shall spoil the Egyptians (Exodus 3:21-22). What once belonged to the enemy, now funded the work of God's people.

Wealth Transfer # 6: Solomon

The sixth wealth transfer occurred with Solomon. God raised him up and gave him vast wealth and wisdom. In fact, Solomon had more wealth than all the kings on earth. People traveled from all over the world to speak with him because his wisdom was so great (1.Kings 10:23-24). Like every other person described – Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph and Israel – God blessed his servant Solomon immensely.

What made these people so deserving of the blessings they received? What started the process of their wealth distribution? They were all givers, and they kept giving. They didn't even stop when they saw results.

- Abraham built many altars and continued making offerings to the Lord, (Genesis 12:5-8).
- Isaac sowed in the land and continually gave to the Lord, (Genesis 26:12).
- Jacob built altars and returned 10% of everything he received back to the Lord, (Genesis 28:22).
- Joseph gave continually (Genesis 42:45; 47:11).
- Israel gave a lamb from each house as a sacrifice to the Lord, (Exodus 12:21).
- Solomon built the Lord's house as well as altars, and gave extravagantly to the Lord (1.Kings 8:13; 9:11).

The principle is clear: Giving is an act of obedience and worship, and it triggers a harvest.

Wealth Transfer # 7: The Body of Christ

That's me and You! How about you? As part of the body of Christ, are you ready to receive your wealth transfer? If so, you must first be obedient to give. This act of worship acts upon your faith, proclaiming that you believe the Word of God. We are living in the last days, and now is the time for aggressive faith. It's time for us as believers of Jesus Christ to let our faith rise to a new level so that a wealth transfer can invade our lives. Why would we want that? So we can reach the world with this blessed message of salvation, hope, and healing.

When you are faithful to the Lord's leading and are obedient to His Word, God promises that you'll be blessed going in and going out (Deut. 28). So when you give, keep your expectations high. Believe that you will receive. And as you do, write down what you are believing God for. Whose lives do you want to see changed? What message do you want to see shared with the world? Who do you know who needs healing – spirit, soul, and body?

Now is the time to get them that word they need!

- Attach it to your refrigerator.
- Tape it to your bathroom mirror.
- Post it next to your computer.
- Set your eyes on it.
- And never doubt.

Right now, consider sowing an extravagant gift – one that requires a sacrifice on your part – into the work of His ministry to bring that message to the world. And as you do, believe that God will send you a harvest – a wealth transfer – like never before. Don't miss it. Don't limit God. Believe He will do what He has promised to do and what many are already experiencing.

- Sow a seed.
- Make a list of what you are believing God for.
- Water your gift with praise.
- And never doubt that your heavenly Father will keep His promise.

And then pray: Lord, I believe You and nobody else. I believe Your word and none other. This is the time, Lord. I'm going to sow a seed. This is the time I'm going to go beyond anything I've ever done before, and I thank You for all You are going to do in my life!
